Also, a big thank you as we were able to offer wonderful dinners prior to our Wednesday night services under the direction of Jane and her team! One of the things we've been trying to reinstitute is an intentional time of silent meditation and prayer prior to the services. ## Stewardship Corner

### Defining Christian Stewardship

Brief descriptions or definitions of Christian stewardship are easy to find. There are so many books or resources on the topic of stewardship that they could fill several bookshelves. Each book or resource offers its own special definition. In addition, Lutherans, Methodists, Baptists, Catholics and so forth offer their unique definition of Christian stewardship. The LCMS states the following: "Christian stewardship is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God's family, the Church, in managing all of life and life's resources for God's Purposes."

Books and resources on stewardship are helpful, but Christian stewardship is founded upon the Word of God. The Apostle Paul's letter to Titus, chapter two, verses 11-14, gives a wonderful summary of the foundation for Christian stewardship.

*For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation for all people, training us to renounce ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright, and godly lives in the present age, waiting for our blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ, Who gave Himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession who are zealous for good works.*

In this text, God's grace revealed through Jesus Christ empowers us to reject ungodliness and live self-controlled and upright lives. God's grace makes our stewardship possible. Grace not only opens our hearts to receive the gift of faith leading to salvation. That same grace enables us to use our time, talents, and resources for God's purposes. Grace turns our minds and hearts to Jesus, and we can live the lives that He wants us to live. Rather than live lives driven by worldly passions, He enables us to live transformed lives that are "self-controlled, upright, and godly." In verse 14 of the passage above, Paul tells us that, since Christ has redeemed us from sin and its power, we are to have a zeal or passion to do good works. We are saved by grace through faith for good works.

From Paul's letter to Titus, we understand that Christian stewardship begins with the grace of God. Everything we are and do is the result of God's grace in Christ. Our stewardship impacts our relationship with God, with our neighbors, and with all of creation. May God help us use the resources that He has entrusted to us in such way that others come to know and trust in the Lord. God's blessings on your stewardship journey!

# The Time of Easter

## Holy Week

*The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.*  
(The Verse for Monday in Holy Week, Lutheran Service Book Altar Book, p. 586)

Easter was the first festival the Early Church celebrated. Lent, Holy Week, and the Triduum – the three holy days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday – with their progressively penitential character, help prepare us for the celebration of the central events of our faith: Christ’s death and resurrection.

## Easter

*Alleluia! [Christ Jesus] abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel.*

*Alleluia!* (The Verse for Easter Day, Lutheran Service Book Altar Book, p. 596)

The joyous Easter season lasts for seven weeks, up to the Day of Pentecost. It is the celebration of the very heart of the Christian faith – the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead and His defeat of sin, death, and the devil for all who have faith in Him. Lectionary readings during this season come mainly from the Gospel of John and highlight Jesus’ resurrection appearances and His teachings about Himself: “I am the vine,” “I am the good shepherd,” and others.



## Hope in the Word

We are now three months into developing the habit of reading God’s Word using *“Hope in the Word (The 5x5x5 New Testament Reading Plan)”*. For many Christians, spending time personally reading Scripture enriches their faith walk with the Holy Spirit. As well, it keeps us ever mindful of how the Spirit renews our relationship with the Lord, meditating on and applying God’s Holy Word in our everyday lives.

## Deep Faith in a Shallow World

My mother-in-law loves to tell this story of her youngest child on the bus. It goes something like this. My sister-in-law rode the bus to get to school every day. Because of how rowdy kids can be on a bus (whether they're riding for 5 minutes or 50), the bus driver had decided that it was necessary to assign seats. She would bring her Bible with her on the bus and one day she started reading parts of it to the younger girl who was her assigned bus buddy.

### The Gift of God's Love

After some time had passed of her doing this, she asked the girl if she had a Bible of her own. She did not. My sister-in-law went home that night and asked her parents if she could give her bus buddy her own.

It's a great story of how God works through the mundane. It's also a sobering reminder of the times we live in now.

Our children do not have the luxury of growing up with what one pastor near me calls "home field advantage." Church numbers are in decline across the board and it is very likely that many of your children's friends will not come from homes that are well-versed in the Bible. While one could sit and lament the state of the church, let's be reminded of the opportunity our children have to be "prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15).

### Strengthen Faith at Church

In order to help our children maintain, strengthen, and share their faith, they truly need to gather with Christian brothers and sisters in worship. What does this mean? The author of Hebrews reminds us church participation matters as God strengthens us through His Word and the Sacraments. In order to hold fast to our confession of faith we need not be "neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." (Hebrews 10:25). When we hear God's Word, sing His praises, and pray together, we are encouraging one another, that, in turn pushes our children's faith walk further. Sunday School lessons with peers for you and your children, teachers or mentors that you can go to with questions, and tasting forgiveness week after week—all of these elements work to strengthen your spiritual walk for life beyond the church parking lot.

We sometimes emphasize walking with God beyond Sunday at church, and that is a beautiful thing, but let's not forget that God has given us the time of worship to center us and others on His Word.

## Deep Faith, cont.

### Equip for Questions at Home

If we only ever speak about Jesus in our homes during special times of the year, we miss out on many opportunities to teach our children how to think, pray, and lean-in during questions or times of doubt. Creating a space where children can ask the "what does this mean" question or wonder about a teaching in Scripture helps to train them for when they encounter these same questions and confusions outside your home. Honestly, this is part of what the Everyday Faith calendar aims to do. It aims to aid you in creating space for your children to wonder and think deeply about Scripture, Jesus, and their life in faith.

### Be an Easter Person in the World

Easter is an entire season of the church year, not just one day of celebration. The Easter season of the church calendar is marked by rejoicing in the celebration of the risen Christ. It's a remembrance of the Person in history Who actually walked the earth. The Man Who was unjustly executed by corrupt people, but Who didn't stay in the grave and walked the earth again. Easter is a day to remember that we do not fight *for* victory over sin, death, and the devil but *from* victory. We know the story, and the story does not end with death but with new life.

To be an "Easter Person," a phrase that harkens back to St. Augustine's exposition on Psalm 148, is to live knowing the joy that is to come. It's to live in such a way that people might ask about the hope that you cling to (1 Peter 3:15). In Hebrews, the author reminds us that in order to live in a broken world we must be "looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. (12:2).

In 2 Corinthians 3:3, Paul says,

*"And you show that you are a letter from Christ delivered by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts."*

In a world marred with death, strife, and struggle—try to exhibit the fruit of the Spirit. Be kind when it would be easier to be unkind. Be a source of peace when others seem chaotic. Your children will model this in their own lives as they continue building trust in the forgiveness which flows from the cross, blooms in the resurrection, and looks toward the life of the world to come. And God has called you—their parent—to aid in passing the faith to them and through them.

## The Holy Land Christians to be Our Guests April 12

The Holy Land Christians will be our guests on Sunday, April 12, and bring some of their beautiful olivewood crafts. In a brief presentation at the end of our worship service, we will hear about the Christians of the Holy Land. In the lobby we will see a nice display of handmade olive wood religious articles from Bethlehem. These articles will be available for sale. The carvings include olivewood Nativity sets, crosses, Christmas ornaments, candle holders, angels and many other religious crafts that could make a nice gift for a wedding, baptism, confirmation, Easter or Christmas. The carvings are handmade by Christian families from Bethlehem who rely on it for their daily bread.

More than 70% of the Christian Community in the Holy Land depend upon tourism as their only source of income. For decades those Christians have been enduring many hardships as tourism in Bethlehem has plummeted and access to other sources of income has been sharply restricted due to the ongoing conflict, the wars, the 12-yard wall built around Bethlehem, the COVID-19 pandemic, and most recently, the catastrophic war in Gaza. Tourists are afraid and have been unable to visit. This has made it very difficult for Christian families and has forced many to flee their homeland. The Christian population in the Holy Land has dropped from 30% in the last century to less than 1% today. If this trend continues, in a few years there will be no Christians living in the land of Christ, which could cause tragic consequences to our faith and the holy sites.

Please help support our Christian brothers and sisters in the town of Bethlehem where Christ was born by buying their carvings.

All proceeds go to support Christian families in Bethlehem.

A team of LCMS Christian women from various LCMS congregations would work along with POBLO missionaries and a female Afghan Coordinator to build a healthy environment, fertile to share the saving message of Jesus with hundreds of Afghan and Arabs in Michigan so that some could be saved (1 Corinthians 9:22).

The Michigan District LWML, meeting in Grand Rapids in 2024, granted \$1,550.00 to enable an effective and culturally relevant outreach and sharing of the Gospel to Afghan and Arab women living in Michigan.
