Dear Ones in our Risen and Reigning LORD and Savior Jesus Christ,

A couple of months ago Carol and I were in Holland, Michigan. Holland is a delightful town although at the time of our visit not even frozen tulips were in evidence. We walked in the downtown area and, as you may know, Hope College takes up many blocks in Holland. Hope College is, ostensibly, a Christian college, although I don't know how much it holds to its Christian confession anymore. One thing I did notice, to my dismay, as we were walking along is that Hope College has an Office of "Diversity, Equality (or is the word equity?), and Inclusivity." Sounds pretty good, doesn't it? Of course, if you take a closer look, you might see a completely different understanding and meaning of those terms.

As a student of history, I was reminded of the "battle cry" from the French Revolution: "They took as their slogan the famous phrase, 'Liberté, Égalité, Fraternité' – Liberty, Equality, Fraternity. Equality, or doing away with privilege, was the most important part of the slogan to the French revolutionists. For equality they were willing to sacrifice their political liberty." (Emphasis mine) During the French "Reign of Terror" (1793-1794), some 300,000 citizens were arrested, 40,000 were murdered, including 17,000 that were beheaded via the guillotine! The Church and its ministers suffered greatly due to attacks and killings because the French turned to worshipping "the Goddess of Reason!" ("It's the Science," after all.) How different from our American Revolution, which was concluded a few years earlier, when colonists who opposed the new America were left in peace instead of being lined up for execution!

My main concern is that our institutions, including colleges and universities, even down to our kindergartens and elementary schools, are teaching an anti-American, anti-Church, anti-nuclear family philosophy to their students. It may be called "Critical Race Theory" (or some cleverly disguised version of it) which teaches kids to regard their skin color and gender as the most important features of their identity as persons.

You might think, "Well, that's not happening in my child's school." Don't be so sure; I was talking to a doctor friend living in Lenawee County who said his grandson was being taught that there are four genders! Maybe it's time to attend your child's school board meeting to find out what they are being taught?

It seems to me that both Church and Nation are being adversely affected with this redefinition of what once was completely valid terminology. I mean, who wouldn't support "Diversity, Equality, and Inclusivity?" Actually, it is the Church and we Christians, holding to the teachings of Holy Scripture, who can embrace God's desire for real diversity, not the "lockstep" demanded by secular diversity, equality and inclusivity which, frankly, fails in every area. Secular diversity is a demand for strict adherence to only one way of thinking. Secular equality disparages any individual achievement, instead it divides people by skin color or group identity. Secular inclusivity includes only those who fully (and loudly) ascribe to the politically/culturally correct viewpoints.

A portion of the poem, "The Second Coming," by William B. Yeats, comes to mind: "Turning and turning in the widening gyre – The falcon cannot hear the falconer; Things fall apart; the centre cannot hold; Mere anarchy is loosed upon the world, the blood-dimmed tide is loosed, and everywhere The ceremony of innocence is drowned; The best lack all conviction, while the worst, Are full of passionate intensity."

## Stewardship Corner

### Channels of God's Amazing Love

Because God is love, His nature is to love. Love is not merely an attribute of God; it is His character. "God is love," (1 John 4:8), and His love to us is a gift. From the time that He created the world, God has never stopped pouring out His love. He gives us His complete and perfect love not because we are worthy or attractive people, but because He is a God of unfathomable love. That love moved Him to give His Son to rescue us from sin that entered the world when Adam and Eve disobeyed God by eating the forbidden fruit. Out of obedience to His Father and love for us, Jesus gave His life for us. Through His birth, life, death, and resurrection from that death, we through faith have received the forgiveness of our sins and life eternal.

We often find it very difficult to love someone we believe does not deserve our love or who does not reciprocate our love. God's love overcomes those barriers that each of us has. He loves us even though we are unworthy of His love. He doesn't love us because we please Him. He loves us simply because He is love. His love is unconditional. This is the difference between God and us. Since "God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8), we must realize that we, too, are undeserving. How can we withhold love from others when we ourselves have received such abundant, undeserved love from our Father in Christ?

God charges us to share His love. As the Holy Spirit leads and directs us, convicts and encourages us, the command to love others becomes a joy, not an obligation. It is God's love flowing through us to others that makes loving others natural and joyful. Throughout God's Word, He calls us to love everyone which includes not only our families and friends but our enemies, neighbors, and strangers. Jesus tells His disciples that, when they feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, care for the sick and visit those in prison, they are really doing it for Jesus (Matthew 25:35-40). When we love our neighbors, God's love is perfected and shown in us and through us.

God's love to us in Christ is that power that enables us to love Him and others. "We love because He first loved us" (1 John 4:19). By God's grace, we become people responding out of love to serve those He places in our lives. When needs arise, Jesus opens our eyes and hearts so we can respond to those needs. The Apostle John wrote, "But if anyone has the world's goods and (continued in next column)

sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God love abide in him?" (1 John 3:17). Are others seeing God's love through us?" May God help us all be channels of God's amazing love.

## Mighty Mites at Work

We praise and thank our mighty God for His love and His grace so we can reach the Michigan District Mite Goal for 2020-2022 and the National Mite Goal for 2021-2023!

This month as you put money into your mite container, say a prayer for Lutheran Association of Missionary Pilots (LAMP) Ministry, Inc..

LAMP Ministry Inc.'s mission is to go "...to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8b) and LAMP envisions the day when nations walk together in the light of Christ (Revelation 7:9).

There are nearly one million Indigenous people, half of whom as children living in the remotest areas of northern Canada, who have limited access to biblical education and Gospel proclamation. This is why LAMP sends missionaries to them.

LAMP requires small, well-equipped airplanes to transport staff and volunteer missionaries to teach the Scriptures and proclaim the Gospel in remote northern communities. LAMP aircrafts currently require a significant avionic instrument upgrade to ensure safe and efficient flights for pilots and missionaries.

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League, meeting in convention in June 2021, granted the sum of \$65,000 to help fund LAMP Ministry, Inc.'s "Propelling the Gospel."
